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INTRODUCTION & OVERVIEW

On April 12, 2016, the San Benito County Board of Supervisors approved a contract with Farmhouse Communications (Farmhouse) of Hollister, California to provide services related to the implementation of Rapid Response Lay-Off Aversion Activities for the San Benito County Workforce Development Board (WDB) with all activities to be implemented by June 30, 2016.

During the months of May and June 2016, Farmhouse conducted a confidential, county-wide business survey in San Benito County. More than 450 businesses were reached via telephone, online via email and in on-site visits in Hollister and San Juan Bautista. 100 business owners and managers completed the survey, 87 surveys were completed in English and 13 in Spanish.

The survey provided an opportunity to connect with businesses, to determine their overall health, struggles and the general status of their operations. Two bilingual outreach teams visited business districts in San Juan Bautista and Hollister to connect with business owners and managers to garner their feedback. The survey instrument was patterned after that conducted by the California State University Monterey Bay Small Business Development Center in 2012 and was delivered in hardcopy and online versions in both English and Spanish.

The survey was designed to collect information on local businesses with the goal of improving County services to businesses as well as ascertain if there were any specific areas of assistance needed to assist businesses to sustain and grow their operations and avoid layoffs. Work by Farmhouse Communications and affiliates is ongoing.

Dozens of business owners/managers responded to widely broadcasted invitations to attend an "Ask the Experts" business resource event coordinated by Farmhouse Communications hosted the morning of Wednesday, June 15 at Paine's Restaurant in downtown Hollister. The event featured 25 agency experts from throughout the state in several categories including:

- Workforce development, training and evaluation
- Business management, planning and marketing
- Finance
- Licensing and permitting
- Water, energy, waste & recycling

In response to businesses who were either self-identified or identified by staff as at risk, in need of Rapid Response Lay-Off Aversion services, the consultant, staff and business support organizations and leaders were assembled to avoid reductions and closures, to help the business to sustain and grow their employee base and assist in providing services for displaced workers when necessary.

Survey & Business Support Program Promotion

The "At Your Service" survey, "Ask the Experts" business resource event and Rapid Response and Layoff Aversion Program were publicized extensively throughout San Benito county, utilizing the following methods:

- Development of a custom website and email account for the program- BusinessinSanBenito.com
- Press releases and calendar advisories in the Hollister Free Lance, BenitoLink and San Juan Mission Village Voice
- Paid advertisement in Hollister Free Lance
- Announcements via broadcast email sent directly to businesses- Chamber of Commerce, Business Council, EDC and Hispanic Chamber members, EDD business contact list, City of Hollister Business License List
- Social media- Twitter, LinkedIn and Facebook (with boosted posts and paid, direct ads)
 - o A "Business in San Benito" Facebook page was also created for this program
 - Postings were cross-promoted on the County Workforce Development Board Facebook page as well as several community information pages
- Program promotional flyers in English & Spanish
- Community Media Access Partnership (CMAP) and CSUMB Small Business Development Center Workshops and Training Events Calendars

In order to appeal to business owners and managers to participate in the survey, those who completed the survey were provided with an option to enter a drawing to receive up to 5 hours of complimentary marketing and PR consulting services (a \$1000+ value) from Farmhouse.

"AT YOUR SERVICE" BUSINESS SURVEY

Survey Instrument Development, Methodology & Delivery

To conduct a survey and attempt to understand the current needs and challenges of businesses in San Benito county, a survey research approach was implemented.

The survey instrument was based upon the 2012 survey developed by the CSUMB SBDC which was enhanced to address current programs and technologies. The instrument was reviewed, edited and approved by County workforce development staff led by Enrique Arreola, Deputy Director Health & Human Services Agency Community Services and Workforce Development.

Surveys were developed in English & Spanish, in paper/hard copy form as well as online utilizing the Constant Contact survey program also known as Survey Monkey. The online survey was also posted in a custom website developed for the program located at BusinessinSanBenito.com. In order to encourage and facilitate a climate of forthright communications, including providing sensitive business information, the identity of respondents was used for internal identification and support assistance purposes only.

The sample of businesses was self-selected for online participation and randomly selected for physical, grassroots, bilingual outreach. Businesses located within the following areas were visited between 10:00AM and 6:00PM on May 31, June 6-10 and 13-14, provided with program information and conducting facilitated online surveys utilizing tablet computers and laptops:


- Hollister: McCray St./ San Benito St./San Felipe Rd. reaching 95 businesses and conducting 45 surveys
- Hollister: Fairview Rd./Hillcrest/Industrial reaching 20 businesses and conducting 7 surveys
- Hollister: Tres Pinos Rd. reaching 10 businesses and conducting 10 surveys
- San Juan Bautista: 1st, 2nd, 3rd Streets reaching 45 businesses and conducting 25 surveys

Data Gathering


The project's community outreach and engagement team performed the data gathering functions related to this research project based on information provided by San Benito County Workforce Development Board, County staff and staff of the Employment Development Department (EDD). The team also collaborated to promote deliver the survey and business support program components in English and Spanish, online and hard copy formats.

All survey responses were entered into the Constant Contact online survey program. Completed and partial surveys were then exported to spreadsheets for review, analysis and reporting.


Survey Results




100 businesses responded to the survey, the overwhelming majority of the businesses operate in the service category.




The average number of years that business survey participants have operated in San Benito County is 14.8, and the median is 24.8 years. 25% of surveyed businesses have operated in San Benito for 20 or more years, including a business that has operated for 116 years. The majority of businesses in San Benito were founded locally. 71% originated in San Benito and the remaining 29% were founded in Gilroy, Salinas, Campbell, Cupertino, Modesto, Delano, Riverside, Irvine and Chicago.



The majority of business owners, 55% classify their businesses as stable. The large number of stable responses with the addition of moderately expanding businesses suggests that business owners are optimistic about their future and few feel they are declining.




Outlook for future business is favorable as 62% of businesses expect sales to grow. Local businesses are benefitting from the improved local economy, lower unemployment rate, increase in discretionary incomes. Many businesses are seeking opportunities to expand their location.




72% of the surveyed businesses in San Benito County lease their operating space. Business owners were asked if they would expand or downsize their physical location within the next two years, 15% are planning to expand with at least two businesses planning to remodel and expanding into an adjacent space and 5 planning to either close or downsize. When asked if new products or services would be introduced in the next two years, 16% responded affirmatively. Many businesses feel that the economy is improving.

There was interest from some lease holders for additional information on commercial properties available for sale. These owners would like to stay in San Benito County, but would like to own rather than lease.



The companies surveyed employ over 1508 employees, the service and distribution industries employs the majority (numbers skewed by major employer).




Of the surveyed businesses, 88% of employees receive their training from peers "on the job", 12% from a vocational schools or programs, 1% from a local college and 1% holds a requirement of advanced and/or college degrees for the majority of their employees.




6% of employers mentioned difficulties achieving productivity from their workforce. The most significant is the ability to recruit and retain local employees. Several business owners were worried about their ability to maintain competitive wages and dealing with challenges in the work ethic and lack of personal drive of employees.

9% of employers expect to have a decrease in employees within the next two years. Several business owners 87% mentioned that they do not plan to have a reduced workforce. One business is expecting to grow. Many small businesses referred to challenges with wage and benefit compliance.


Internet



59% of businesses indicated that internet access is vital to their business and it utilized by the majority of businesses for managing banking and finances followed by communications (email & calendaring), customer service, networking/social networking and business promotion/information. 21% of survey respondents indicated that they don't utilize the internet- all of which are small, Latino-owned businesses the majority of which are owned and/or managed by monolingual Spanish speakers.



Internet access continues to be a challenge for local businesses as they indicated a desire for general access to high speed internet in addition to higher connection speeds, reliability and affordability though 86% of respondents indicated neutral or higher satisfaction with their current service- a weighted average of 3.5 on a scale of 1 to 5 from highly dissatisfied to highly satisfied.




The chart above represents issues that local business owners are struggling with. Their top concern is marketing/communications- confusion with local (City of Hollister and County) sign ordinances, lack of skills or access to effective marketing and advertising programs. Other high ranking obstacles include out of area and online competition, costs of rent and utilities, difficulties in navigating local permit and license requirements and area image/quality of life which is drawing customers and employees to other neighboring communities.

Concerns Expressed by Business Owners

Business owners in San Benito had many other concerns they are listed below:

An overwhelming majority of businesses are seeking assistance with marketing in the form of advertising and promotion. Owners would like a comprehensive marketing strategy to promote the area and sub-regions including downtown Hollister and San Juan Bautista with a focus first on residents, local businesses and employees then visitors. Many owners mentioned Salinas and Gilroy as examples of how to revitalize a downtown. Owners interested in loans, mentioned difficulties they had dealing with large lenders and lack of knowledge of local small business loan programs, especially for small, Latino businesses with Spanish speaking owner/managers. The major need for money was cash flow, equipment, facility and façade improvements.

Businesses in San Juan Bautista said they lacked exposure and are not supportive of the County nor the County Chamber of Commerce. Businesses believe drivers have no idea that San Juan Bautista has many great restaurants and retailers. Owners suggested new and improved signage. Owners were worried about losing the San Juan Bautista "charm" many buildings are in great need of repairs, but it is expensive to repair the buildings, to maintain the historic characteristics and lack of desire by building owners to invest.

Suggestions from Businesses

Below are some other business needs that owners suggested:

"Ask the Experts" Business Resource Event

The San Benito County Workforce Development Board invited local business owners, managers and prospects to a complimentary, comprehensive business resource event hosted Wednesday, June 15 from 7:30-10 a.m. at Paine's Restaurant, 421 East St. in downtown Hollister. The "Ask the Experts" resource event provided information on a diverse array of resources available to businesses. Information resource tables with more than 20 business resource experts were hosted during the event. A brief introduction program began at 8:15 a.m. which provided the opportunity for participating support organizations to provide an overview of their organization and services provided to local businesses. A complimentary, continental breakfast was served. Registration for the event was available online at www.businessinsanbenito.com, via email, telephone and website link distributed widely.

The event drew dozens of business owners and managers and non-profit organizations from throughout the county and more than 25 business resource experts from throughout the state. With an overall goal of sustaining and growing existing businesses, the complementary event provided the avenue for attendees to network, share tools, tips, best practices and programs to help local businesses and organizations thrive- free and low-cost services from employee training and assessment, loan programs, business management, innovation and planning to water, waste and energy reduction.

Local business resource experts and event participants included:

- 1. California Workforce Development Board- Supporting the emergence of effective statewide and regionally driven sector initiatives in policy development, supporting the workforce system, assessing performance and reporting.
- 2. California Employment Training Panel (ETP)- Providing employers funding for job skills training for frontline, incumbent workers in companies challenged by out-of-state competition
- 3. America's Job Center- Easy, one-stop access to the state's employment-related services, helping employers find qualified workers and job seekers find good jobs- posting job openings and recruiting candidates. Job seekers can get assistance in assessing skills, finding job opportunities and training, prepping a résumé, and much more.
- 4. Employment Development Department (EDD)- Supporting and connecting local communities with state programs involving unemployment insurance, disability insurance, payroll tax collection, and job training/workforce services
- 5. Workforce Development Board of San Benito County- Providing employees, training programs and hiring incentives to area employers.
- 6. CSUMB Small Business Development Corporation (SBDC)- Providing entrepreneurs and small businesses with high quality education, consulting, support for innovation and tools necessary to build successful, sustainable businesses

Feedback from Event Participants

Event participants were surveyed informally following the event both during the event and post via telephone and email. The feedback was extremely favorable. Recommendations for future events included timing the event to avoid high-activity times during the year such as this year's event which was hosted when many schools were hosting graduations, letting out for the summer. Additional time for advanced planning would have also afforded the benefit of the opportunity to plan and deliver additional advertising in the form of television, radio, direct mail, placed advertising and cross promoting with local business associations. Participating organizations greatly appreciated the ability to network, identify collaborative and referral opportunities and eliminate duplication in a few instances. Representatives from the California Workforce Development Board stated that they'd like to use the event as a model for others throughout the state.

RAPID RESPONSE & LAY-OFF AVERSION ACTIVITIES

During the course of conducting the survey, 8 businesses were identified as at risk for employee reduction and/or closure and additional 10 businesses were identified via referrals. All other businesses have been referred to the local business services agencies for support.

- Two referred businesses were unresponsive to calls and emails with offers to engage services.
- Two businesses were unfortunately identified on the verge of closure and have suspended operations in San Benito county (one in Hollister and one in San Juan Bautista).
- Two businesses were serviced by County staff and programs including the America's Job Center- one for closure and one for layoffs.
- One major employer is in the process of negotiations on fee and permit programs and is anticipated to double their operations in the next two years resulting in 90+ new jobs. This business is being actively solicited by other Bay Area communities that are offering incentives in the form of tenant improvements, loan programs, tax incentives and more.
 - This business was retained by engaging local elected officials, staff, Farmhouse Communications and the leadership of the Economic Development Corporation of San Benito County and the San Benito County Business Council
- Several other businesses are receiving support:
 - From the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce-Central Coast for tax, legal and marketing supportespecially for compliance with local sign ordinances and web marketing
 - From the Grow San Benito Fund for revolving loans to expand operations
 - From the Monterey Bay Area Green Business Program via San Benito County to earn green business certification and affiliated marketing support
 - From local business mentors to assist with navigating permitting from the County Health
 Department

CONCLUSION

Recommendations

Marketing, Outreach and Engagement

Survey results and comments from business owners and managers indicate that they desire support for marketing their businesses. Information regarding services, workshops and local vendors are not reaching them. This can largely be attributed to dated and incorrect contact information, lack of resources for promotion of services via direct mail, ineffective email communications programs, lack of penetration by local traditional email, lack of bilingual and bicultural business support programs and lack of direct engagement by local service agencies and business associations.

Moving forward, it is recommended that lead agencies be identified and tasked with coordinating local business support programs, that a dynamic, multi-faceted strategic engagement plan be developed and implemented with accountability measures to effectively evaluate performance. Performance may be evaluated on an annual basis by updating the "Ask the Experts" survey and conducting follow up inquiries with businesses that requested support as well as with agencies that may have been referred.

Collaboration

Collaboration with in the public, non-profit and educational sectors are necessary to optimize impact of Rapid Response Layoff Aversion and business support programs. In order to better coordinate and ensure more effective service, a service audit should be performed and summary posted and communicated to all audiences. In the event that a response opportunity is identified, a "Red Team" is alerted including County AJC and Rapid Response Staff in addition to the program consultant and affiliated business services agencies across all sectors as applicable to conduct an immediate assessment and employ services and programs as needed.

Finance Management & Loan Programs

Many businesses can benefit from loan programs and to receive administrative support for record keeping, bookkeeping, tax filing and compliance. Support has already been assembled and delivered to several local, small Latino businesses in a collaborative effort of the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce and Farmhouse Communications in hosting a workshop the morning of August 5th with speakers ranging from Assemblymember Luis Alejo to the Board of Equalization and the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development.

Workforce and Employer Training

In order to attract large firms to operate in the available commercial buildings, San Benito County has to demonstrate that there are enough residents with the required skills. The America's Job Center in Hollister has several programs available, but very few business owners are aware they exist. Business owners could also benefit from training, the suggested topics include; marketing, cash flow management, employee retention/training, management. Employer training is harder to implement and in order to be successful requires collaboration from the various resources available.

Next Steps

San Benito County has many challenges and obstacles for all businesses, many that can be surmounted with improved communications and collaboration to connect businesses with services and their customers. A year-round, consistent Rapid Response Layoff Aversion Program and engaged support team will improve the quality and quantity of service delivery and pay major dividends to the County in the form of jobs, income and improved environment to help sustain and attract investment.



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
