




COVID-19 Current COVID- 19 Dashboard

COVID-19 vaccines will be distributed within San Benito County through the local health care system, including Public Health. At this time, vaccine supplies are limited, and it is uncertain when vaccines will be available. Phase and Tiers may change at any time based on recommendations by the CDC and California Department of Public Health.

Depending on vaccine production and how quickly other vaccines become available the best estimate of when the general public, who are not otherwise in Phase 1, could receive the vaccine would be Spring 2021, but that may change. COVID-19 Regional Stay at Home Order and Intensive Care Unit Capacity

On December 6, 2020, the Regional Stay at Home Order was put in effect when the ICU capacity dropped below 15% in the region. The Order will be lifted when a region's projected ICU capacity meets or exceeds 15%. Our current regions ICU capacity is at 0%.

The Order highlights some of the following:

- Its purpose is to prevent the overload of California hospitals so that they can continue to serve communities with trauma response, critical care, and medical/surgical care
- It limits mixing of households because we know that is the most common mode of transmission
- The order prohibits private gatherings of any size, close sector operations except for critical infrastructure and retail, and require 100% masking (with certain exceptions as indicated within guidance for use of face coverings) and physical distancing in all others
- It allows access to (including travel for) critical services and outdoor activities

COVID-19 Workplace Reporting Outbreak Requirements

AB 685 requires that when employers identify 3 or more cases of COVID-19 at a worksite within a 14-day period, they are required to report this to their local health department within 48 hours. This law specifies the type of data that must be reported by the employer and in turn the local health departments reports that data to CDPH. CDPH will begin posting workplace outbreak data by industry/sector pursuant to AB 685 on its website in the coming weeks.

San Benito County Public Health will be rolling out an online workplace outbreak portal that employers can utilize to submit reports of COVID-19 cases in the workplace, including additional resources for employers who are responding to COVID-19 in the workplace. - Communication with the Virtual Assistant Symptom Monitoring System is secure and only accessed via the secure link that is unique to each user. All information shared with the Virtual Assistant is kept confidential and protected by California's strict privacy laws.
- The service is not intended to be a substitute for professional medical advice, diagnosis, or treatment. The personalized secure link provided to you is intended to be used for checking your symptoms only.
- The Virtual Assistant Survey is only available to individuals who are over the age of 18.


