CAL OES UPDATE
March 2022

California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) action:

- 1) The Late January and February 2021 Storms incident (CDAA-2021-05) makes available California Disaster Assistance Act (CDAA) funding for eligible costs in Monterey, *San Benito*, San Luis Obispo, and Santa Cruz counties.



Available Assistance – Public Assistance Program

State cost shares 75 percent and local 25 percent of eligible costs. The types of work eligible are illustrated below:

EMERGENCY WORK

- Debris Removal
(Category A)
- Emergency Response and Protective Measures
(Category B)

PERMANENT WORK

- Roads and Bridges
(Category C)
- Water Control Facilities
(Category D)
- Buildings and Equipment
(Category E)
- Utilities
(Category F)
- Parks, Recreational Facilities, Other Items
(Category G)

1) Per meetings /coordination with Cal OES, funding/reimbursement must be related *directly* to storm event impacts. County of San Benito qualified for:

- Culvert, embankment, minor road repair and debris cleanup
- Road washout reconstruction



1) County of San Benito funding requests deemed appropriate by Cal OES:

- Emergency response and debris cleanup

County cost=\$168,872:

75% reimbursement=\$126,654 + 10% Admin allowance = 12,654

Total reimbursement = \$139,319

- Culvert replacement and roadway repairs

County cost=\$240,000*

- Road washout reconstruction

County cost=\$2,900,000*

**Reimbursement to occur after construction is completed (currently in the design phase)*
