

#### WHAT IS RHNA?

- State Housing Law requires that all jurisdictions must <u>plan</u> to meet the housing needs of the community.
- Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA).
- California Department of Housing & Community Development (HCD) identifies number of units for which the region must <u>plan</u>.
- 6th Cycle RHNA, eight-year planning period 2023 to 2031.
- Regional 6th Cycle allocation is 5,005 units.



### 5 RHNA Objectives

#### Consider 5 RHNA Objectives

- (1) Increasing the housing supply and the mix of housing types, tenure, and affordability in all cities and counties within the region in an equitable manner, which shall result in each jurisdiction receiving an allocation of units for low- and very low income households.
- (2) Promoting infill development and socioeconomic equity, the protection of environmental and agricultural resources, the encouragement of efficient development patterns, and the achievement of the region's greenhouse gas reductions targets provided by the State Air Resources Board pursuant to Section 65080.

### 5 RHNA Objectives

#### Consider 5 RHNA Objectives

- (3) Promoting an improved intraregional relationship between jobs and housing, including an improved balance between the number of low-wage jobs and the number of housing units affordable to low-wage workers in each jurisdiction.
- (4) Allocating a lower proportion of housing need to an income category when a jurisdiction already has a disproportionately high share of households in that income category, as compared to the countywide distribution of households in that category from the most recent American Community Survey.
- (5) Affirmatively furthering fair housing.

#### 13 RHNA Factors

- 1. Jobs and Housing Relationship
- 2. Opportunities/constraints (infrastructure, availability of land, preserved land)
- 3. Maximizing transit and transportation infrastructure
- 4. Directing growth toward incorporated areas
- 5. Loss of assisted housing units
- 6. High housing cost burdens
- 7. Rate of overcrowding
- 8. Farmworkers housing needs
- 9. Housing needs of college students
- 10. Housing needs of those experiencing homelessness
- 11. Loss of units during emergency
- 12. SB 375 GHG reduction targets
- 13. Other factors
