Background

- In January and February 2017, San Benito County and much of the State of California experienced heavy rain leading to widespread flooding events
- The substantial rain, flooding, and mudslides deposited hazardous debris and damaged infrastructure throughout the County, including:
 - Roads and Bridges including Lovers Lane
 - The San Benito County Historical and Recreational Park

Background

 On February 14 and then again on April 2, 2017, the President declared major disasters for the State of California, establishing Disaster Declarations FEMA-4301-DR and FEMA-4308-DR

- San Benito County was is eligible for Public Assistance (PA) reimbursement for the following incident periods:
 - FEMA-4301-DR: January 3 January 12, 2017
 - FEMA-4308-DR: February 1 February 23, 2017

Current Status of Grants

 Since May of 2017, the County Office of Emergency Services has worked directly with an external consulting firm to manage the disaster recovery grants for this recovery

- The County is managing eight disaster recovery grants
 - Five Emergency Work Grants valued at \$409,333
 - Three Permanent Work Grants valued at \$1,457,062
