





New Orleans, Louisiana Per Diem Rates for 2018

New Orleans has a fixed per-diem rate set by the General Services Administration (GSA), which is used to reimburse overnight travel expenses within the area for Federal employees as well as employees of private companies which also use the GSA's per diem rates.

The **lodging per-diem rate** of \$148.00 is intended to cover the costs of one night's lodging at a hotel in New Orleans, based on the average daily rate in the local lodging industry. Many hotels and motels offer business travellers rooms at exactly the local per-diem rate.

The **meals & incidentals rate** (M&IE rate) of \$64.00 is intended to cover the costs of a single days' worth of meals and incidental costs (such as tips and parking) based on the average cost for these expenses in the New Orleans area. If you spend less than the \$64.00 per diem, you can generally keep the remainder.
