Modified or New Scope of Services:

Within FY 18-19 the Public Health Services Emergency Preparedness and Hospital Program Preparedness grant-contractor, Mary White, will complete the following expanded scope of services:

- 1. Review San Benito County (SBC) Communicable Disease manual/plan and regional Ebola response plans to ensure they include legal and regulatory authorities and policies for recommending and implementing non-pharmaceutical interventions (NPI)
- 2. Coordinate with Hospital Coordinator Coalition (HCC) partners to update all related plans accordingly
- 3. Work with HCC partners Public Information Officer's (PIO's) to update public messaging of NPI as needed

- 4. Incorporate learnings from Ebola training attended 5/18 National Ebola Training and Education Center(NTEC) by local nursing staff into SBC Communicable Disease manual
- 5. Work with San Benito County Emergency Services Specialist (SBC ESS) and joint Monterey County (MoCo) HCC to identify top 3 hazards for jurisdiction-joint Hazardous Vulnerability Assessment (HVA)
- 6. Update NPI list accordingly, if deemed necessary
- 7. Incorporate new San Benito County Public Health Services (SBC PHS) policy (Monitoring of persons suspected of Emerging Infectious Disease (EID)) into CD Manual
- 8. Review current plans with SBC PHS nursing and EP staff for how to adapt during escalation and deescalation
- Add surveillance for opioid use and associated overdose deaths utilizing CDPH dashboard as well as local available data (local vital stats, local law enforcement/coroner data) in collaboration with local opioid task force
- 10. Add local mosquito surveillance data to our surveillance modalities
- 11. Update current surveillance/epi investigation plans described within All Hazards and CD Manual with AAR findings from real event 2018 influenza SNF outbreak
- 12. Update CD Manual and All Hazards Manual sections pertaining to epidemiological investigation plans to include surge staff procedures (just-in-time training, etc.)
- 13. Review epi investigation check-list steps (as described in PHS CD Manual) regularly at CD staff meetings as way to address/reinforce continuity plans
- 14. Include areas of improvement noted on CD QA/QI forms into IP Tracking sheet along with determined corrective actions (and update plans to reflect)
- 15. Review procedures for disease reporting with CD nursing staff to keep updated (including any new staff)
- 16. Meet regularly with hospital infection control nurse to ensure compliance with CalREDIE, disease reporting, investigation, coordinating (via CD staff meetings, etc.)
- 17. Maintain list of public health staff level of epidemiological competency; include in CD Manual and/or All Hazards Plan. Current list and scores listed on PHS intranet (m-drive)
- 18. Attend/participate in offsite trainings pertaining to epidemiological and infectious disease
- 19. Amend PHS CD Manual to include communication processes/procedures as it pertains to collaborating with key partners during investigation/outbreak
- 20. Participate in PHS CD group which includes: monthly meetings, reviewing pertinent CD topics, current reportable disease status, etc.
- 21. Review PHS CD Manual for any needed updates to the following sections: individual disease pages
- 22. Review SBC PHS CD Manual chapter on Anthrax with CD staff (including hospital infection control nurse) as an exercise during CD staff meeting (eg. Anthrax Assist Tool)
- 23. Utilize HCC group for communication and collaboration during epidemiological investigations that require coordination across agencies.
- 24. Work with PHS nursing staff for ongoing coordination with local area school nurses for information sharing, training to improve CD prevention/response
- 25. Coordinate outreach/education to local SNF and Assisted Living facilities to enhance awareness and coordination
- 26. Continue to coordinate with local pharmacy-public health workgroup during epidemic investigations/surveillance/mitigation efforts that require pharmacy partnership
- 27. Include testing of PPE during SMHE and/or 2018 mass vaccination clinic
- 28. Participate in various pertinent CDPH and CDC conference calls and webinars regarding current public health issues to assist with readiness
- 29. Assist with Tdap/pertussis education and prevention efforts (health care providers, pharmacies, community, PHS staff)
